

From the Vicar

Happy Easter! I wonder what you mean when you say those words to someone? Have you ever thought about what the words actually mean? Are they just words of good wishes that the person to whom you are talking has a good, happy and perhaps even restful few days away from the normality of life? Wishing someone happiness is easy but what does it really mean to link those wishes to the Christian celebration of Easter?

If you research the word 'Easter' you'll find Anglo-Saxon origins relating to a pre-Christian Spring festival and references to the Greek word 'pascha' which takes us back to the ancient story of Hebrew origin, of the Passover. To wish someone a Happy Easter is to connect them and their lives to historic faith events and the central Christian tenet that God overcomes death. These are big words indeed!

Easter is of course the celebration of Christ's resurrection and the services of Holy Week and Easter remind us of the story and the meaning of God's love for humanity.

How much thought do you give to what comes next – and to the idea of resurrection in particular? This Easter season we have the opportunity to explore the resurrection of Christ in greater depth with Bishop Ian Brackley. Bishop Ian will speak about this central mystery that lies at the heart of the Christian faith. What exactly do we mean by it? Must Christians believe in the Resurrection at all? WINTON PLAYERS 'Tons of Money' - April 18th - 20th

The 1920's saw the birth of the famous Aldwych farces which had audiences rolling in the aisles with laughter. In the 1980s that master of modern comedy, Alan Ayckbourn, cleverly adapted this classic, hilarious, fast moving comedy for modern-day audiences.

The story revolves around, Aubrey, an unsuccessful inventor, who inherits a life interest in a fortune that, in the event of his death, reverts to his cousin George. Since George is thought to have died in Mexico, a plan is hatched by his wife Louise with the brilliant idea of Aubrey "dying" so that he can resurrect himself as George and avoid paying his enormous debts.

As with most farces, the cast of ten eccentric characters spend much of their time dashing in and out of the sitting room through double doors and French Windows. There is the slightly dotty Aunt Benito, who is always in search of her knitting and Giles the gruff gardener, who is forever popping in and out from the garden via the French Windows. Sprules the dodgy butler, his brother Henry and the parlour maid, Simpson, use their special sign language to create chaos. On top of this, Jean, a friend of Aubrey and Louise, arrives to stay and adds more confusion by having some sort of connection to anyone named George.

Meantime, Chesterman, a solicitor, manfully tries to unravel the estate when yet another man enters the scene. Could he be the real George? Confused? You won't be if you come along to see how all this mayhem unfolds and have a jolly good laugh along the way!

Even our curmudgeonly scorer is pointing enthusiastically at the three figures he's just rattled up against my name. I decide to quit while I am ahead and return unbeaten (retired,) back to my normal position at the bar in the pavilion – mission accomplished.

MICE TO MEET YOU Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust

When thinking of mice, some of the first things which spring to mind can often be negative. For millennia, humans have lived alongside them but often viewed them as pests. However, they are widely misunderstood. Mice play a key role in the natural environment; from distributing plant seeds to being prey for animals like owls and foxes. When small rodent populations are low, the number of their predators falls dramatically too.

Varying greatly in appearance, the UK is home to eighteen species of rodent, four of which are mice (dormice aren't actually mice). UK mice do not hibernate and so they must feed throughout the year, so there is potential with a pair of keen eyes to spot them at any time.

The smallest mouse, and the UK's smallest rodent, is the harvest mouse: its body length is just 7cm and weighs just 10g or the weight of a 20p piece! They have chestnut fur and a long, twisty tail that is used to grip plant stems when climbing.

The house mouse is synonymous with sharing buildings with humans. With lots of free food on offer and central heating, it is easy to see why. They are around twice the weight of harvest mice and have a uniform grey/brown coat. They look similar to rats, but are much smaller and shyer, which is why many people with house mice raiding their pantries never actually spot the culprit.

Wood, or fieldmice, can live anywhere. As long as they have safe cover and a good supply of food, they're happy. Like house mice, they will build nests in wall cavities, sheds and garages. But in a natural environment, they make their nests in the bases of trees and shrubs. Around the same size as a house mouse, wood mice are more chestnut-brown and have very large eyes and prominent ears.

Yellow-necked mice are the largest of the UK's mice. They are similar in appearance to wood mice, but around 1.5 times bigger and with a yellow/brown band across the front of their throat. They are very territorial, particularly when food supplies are limited and are dominant over wood and house mice.
