

From the Vicar

One of the greatest joys in the days before Holy Week in April was to welcome all of the children from Greatham Primary School to Greatham Church to explore the Easter story. Each of the six year groups came to think about different aspects of the most important of all Christian festivals. Two of the year groups recreated the Last Supper; two other groups recreated the Palm Sunday road into Jerusalem and two groups explored the crucifixion and resurrection stained glass window and the feelings that those images portray. We got inside the Easter story in wonderful depth but it can be a real challenge for children and adults to remember that Easter doesn't end on Easter Sunday – it begins!

The Easter season continues as we think in our churches about the resurrection appearances of Jesus right up until Ascension Day on 9th May when we remember his lifting up to heaven and then God's glorious manifestation as Holy Spirit at Pentecost – or Whitsun as we used to call it.

We will mark Ascension Day in the Benefice this year with a Yewlian Meeting at Priors Dean. If you have never been to a Yewlian Meeting and the idea of the Ascension of Jesus leaves you completely lost for words, then this is the moment for you. Yewlian Meetings are opportunities for silence and contemplative prayer. A short reading followed by 30 minutes of silence before finishing with a prayer. All are very welcome.

The peacefulness of a Yewlian meeting also gives a focus for our prayers for peace in the world. We live in dreadful times and our prayers are needed now more than ever. When we are lost for words, pray in silence that the risen ascended Lord will help us to build a safer, kinder, cleaner and fairer world in which to live.

MEMORIES OF GREATHAM

I was born in 1954 and spent the first 23 years living in Greatham on the A325 road, before moving to Petersfield which has been my home ever since. Seeing the heading 'Apple Pie Depot' in the April magazine brought memories flooding back. So here are a few personal ones.

Apple Pie Hill represented Longmoor Army Camp which was an important part of the local economy as it provided employment to a civilian workforce drawn from the local area. We were used to the sounds of rat-a-tat-tat, occasional booms and the armoured personnel carriers driving along the A325 which shook the foundations of the house. We were used to the noise as the Army had to practice manoeuvres somewhere. At one time a different noise was heard on the moor between the Camp and the A325 as a Scottish soldier played his bagpipes away from near neighbours.

The Longmoor Military Railway, every steam train enthusiast's dream, brought an occasional star or two to Greatham when film companies used the line in very famous films. The last film shot on the line was Young Winston and the tracks were pulled up immediately afterwards.

Many more memories to come, as Greatham today is so different from the village I grew up in.

EMPSHOTT & HAWKLEY GARDENERS CLUB

April was a busy month for the Club. The Spring Show on 6th April was very successful, with 23 exhibitors and 113 exhibits. Judges commented positively on the quantity and quality of the flowers shown, particularly in light of the adverse weather this Spring. Sue Potts-Bury won the Challenge Cup, with an impressive 57 points from 22 exhibits. Tony Madeley's beautiful pot of daffodils won Best in Show and Mary Crittenden won most points in the flower arranging categories. The 7 children's exhibits were a delight and the judge was pleased to award all 7 with rosettes and wrote nice comments to them all

On 15 April Rachel Remnant gave an inspiring illustrated talk on reviving traditional meadow hay making skills, drawing on her extensive professional knowledge and experience in Hampshire and two research visits to Transylvania in 2016 and 2023. She highlighted how these traditional skills, which have been largely lost in England since the 1950s and 60s, not only enhance the physical environment but also enrich communities, creating strong links between people and the food they grow and eat. Lively discussion and questions afterwards explored the benefits for us in the South Downs.

Playground Update:

Well we were a bit premature with trying to open the playground! Who would have imagined that we would have had so much rain. But with everything crossed we are going to try again and hold the official opening of the playground on Saturday 27th April at 10 am. Please do come along and enjoy the event.

We have had a few questions about the suitability of the fence between the playground and the car park. This will be reviewed once we have received the inspection report and the playground is open.

Telephone Box:

We are finished off the telephone box refurbishment now that it is in situ. Once completed, we will be asking for suggestions on what it should be used for. Please let us know what you would like it to be.

Defibrillators:

All 3 defib units are now in place. Once is at St Johns Church rooms, one is at the Village Hall and one is at Eurotec at the front of their building. Hopefully they are not needed often but it is great that as a village we are so well covered.

Upcoming Meetings:

Our Annual Meeting will be held on **Wednesday 8th May 2024** @ 7.30 pm, but will run to around 9.30 pm as we have a lot to cover. This is our formal meeting to re-state positions of councillors and appoint our working parties etc. We will also be reviewing the end of year accounts for the Parish Council.

Our Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Wednesday 22nd April 2024 @ 7.30 pm. We will have refreshments, an update from our Chairman on the year we have just had, and we will discuss plans for the coming years and where the village thinks we should focus our time and attention.

Parish Council Meeting 10th April 2024:

The meeting was chaired by Cllr Rudd, in the absence of Cllr Lafferty. We voted that Cllr Lafferty will remain as Chair for the next year, and Cllr Rudd will remain as Vice Chair.

Cllr Oppenheimer sent a report noting that community transport is a priority for HCC. If you feel there is a need for the village to have our own Community transport which can be a minibus or taxibus, please let your councillors know.

We have a very positive financial position currently with monies from EHDC and SDNP to support the playground build. The first payment has been made to the contractor, with a second now due. Careful management of our bank accounts and spending will ensure we are in good shape to move into the new financial year.

WEIRD AND WONDERFUL PLANT NAMES

Plants can have many names. An individual plant may be known by a common name (of which there may be several) along with its Latin name (which is unique to each plant). These names are frequently descriptive, and can also be quite simple or just totally bizarre.

A widespread and common plant with an amusing name is the Fat Hen (*Chenopodium album*). This plant grows in gardens, arable fields, roadsides, hedgerows and many other habitats. It is so common that it is often considered a weed. The Fat Hen flowers from June to October with spikes of whitish flowers rising from diamond shaped leaves. Before the introduction of spinach, it was often served boiled and buttered alongside meat. These days, it is considered a good food source for birds and insects. Fat Hen also goes by several other obscure names, including Bacon Weed, Dirty Dick, Goose Foot, Lamb's Quarters (USA) and Pig Weed.

Creeping Jenny (Lysimachia nummularia) is a low growing perennial plant found it wetlands, riverbanks, ponds and wet woodland. Flowering from May to August and most prevalent in Southern England, the Creeping Jenny has a sunshine-yellow, cup-like flower crowning stalks that branch off a main stem. Its name derives from how the plant will 'creep' or spread through wet habitats with its spreading mats of long stems. A hardy plant with evergreen leaves and an attractive flower, it is a popular plant for gardeners to grow alongside a pond or water feature.

One of the strangest plant names is the Moschatel Town Hall Clock (Adoxa moschatellina). Firstly, the 'moschatel' part comes from the flower's musk-like scent. As for the 'Town Hall Clock' part, that is in reference to how the flowers face out in four different directions 90 degrees to each other sitting on top of an erect, slender stem. Each stem has five flowers with fifth facing upwards. This plant can be seen flowering between April and May and is widespread through most of the UK. It prefers shaded, moist habitats and is often found in deciduous woodland.
