Portsmouth Family Welfare

We heard last week of the very sad news that the Portsmouth Family Welfare, the charity supported for many years by Hawkley Church, is to close. The principal reasons are the difficulty in recruiting volunteers and the in obtaining sufficient grant funding to enable the trustees to continue. PFW, which has records dating back to 1902, has served the city and its poorest families for more than a century and it will be a sadness to a great many people across our Diocese. Hawkley PCC will decide the best way in which it can in future direct its charitable giving. PFW have written to thank us especially for the generous support, both in terms of donated food and household items as well as significant financial giving and our particular thanks here to those who have regularly transported good to Portsmouth. Please, for the moment, and until we find an alternative, <u>do not leave items</u> in the Hawkley Church porch. Thank you.
